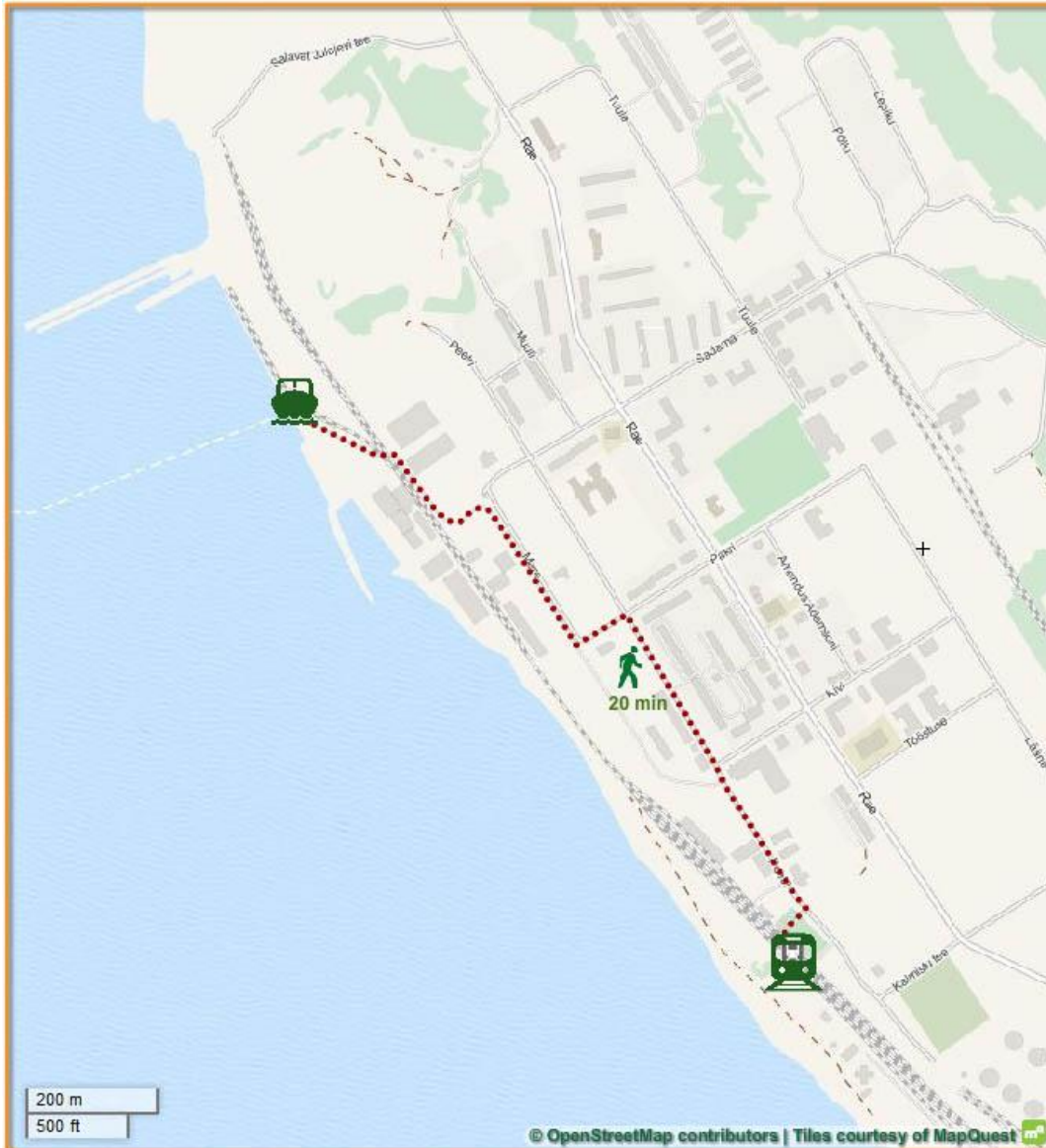


## Paldiski



Paldiski is a former Russian (and later Soviet) military base. It was a closed town until 1994. Once inhabited by 16.000 soldiers, it is today populated by only 4.000 people.

So the only thing to see are some almost desolated living blocks (the scenery for the social critical movie 'Lilya 4-Ever') and the abandoned premises of the former Soviet training center for nuclear submarine personnel (looking like a power plant).

**Passenger Terminal of Paldiski Port** is rather small. Small shop & café sometimes opened.

### **Train Paldiski – Tallinn**

**Frequency:** 7 trains a day, irregular intervals

### **Paldiski Railway Station:**

The Railway Station is rather abandoned, except a small bar. But on the walking route between Ferry Terminal – Railway Station a grocery store and a quite good tavern ('Tavern Peetri Toll' in mere 10) are situated.

If the ticket office at Railway Station is closed, ticket may be bought at conductor.
